"Our staff this year has given it their all to provide you with an amazing yearbook," yearbook editor-in-chief Karyssa Hall said.


As an extra incentive to purchase a yearbook by the deadline, the yearbook

Bass are the most sought out sport fish in the world. They are elusive, smart and fun to catch. They are one of the top predatory fish in freshwater. They have millions of years of instincts which makes them a tough one to catch. They also have the ability to outsmart the fisherman pursuing them.

Spring is on its way and that means the spawn for Bass is on. This time of year they breed and lay their eggs. I am going to give you some tips so you can get those giants off their beds. The bass sit on their beds and protect their eggs from other fish. The mother can go weeks without eating to insure the survival of their offspring.

Bed fishing for bass is tough and there are a lot of challenges you will face. The bass usually lay eggs near the bank in shallower water, this makes it easier to hear and spot the fisherman. The best way to avoid being heard is to approach quietly. Make sure you can see the bed and have

patience. The mother may not be on the bed at first but wait a while and she will come back.

The bait you should use is also very important and vital. The colors of your bait need to be a natural color such as greens, browns and colors of local bait fish. The type of bait that work the best are Senkos and Wacky worms.

The best bait is one that imitates a bait fish such as a bluegill or minnow. The bait fish will eat the eggs which causes the mother to attack or eat the fish. It is the same concept with your bait.

You should work your bait slow but add sharp movement while fishing the bait. The quick movement will cause a reaction strike, this means the bass will attack your bait because it is irritated.

As an avid fisherman I advise you to throw the fish back. The bass will return to its bed and still protect its young, and insure the survival of her young. Every bass fisherman wants to keep the bass population healthy and to keep it growing so that generations to come may enjoy chasing the elusive Bass.
